If neither numbers nor money is a significant measure of your blog's success, what is the key to success for you?





## **EXPANSIVE INNER WORLDS**



Another post called "Vodka" referred to the quote from Zdzislaw Beksinski. A well-known Polish painter said that art for people is like vodka offered to a convict. Drinking alcohol is stunning and dazzling. The alcoholic drink falsifies and colors the gray reality for some people. In this way, alcohol helps people survive in this world and make people doomed to death. For me, this type of statement is a sad, even tragic vision of life. Beksinski's comment is an accurate and valuable observation. I would agree with the Polish painter's analysis. Broadly understood art, like vodka, gives us joy. It provides relaxation and the development of imagination, both for creators and recipients. Art can enrich people with new experiences. It opens up new dimensions in our souls and minds. The broadly understood creation of new things can open our inner vision to new things. Often these things are difficult to assimilate. They can also be inconvenient for us.

Nevertheless, art keeps us moving forward, unlike vodka, which instead degenerates us. Vodka (as well as all alcohol) just makes us dizzy. Drinking alcohol makes us dumber, lazy and destroys our body, mind, and soul in the long run. Alcohol is a fraud, trickster. It gives us immediate gratification. Usually, however, we have more trouble consuming large amounts of it.

# ARTWORK DESCRIPTION



About the fact that there is a general rule that an artist should always have something to say about his works, I "Artwork wrote post: **Description.**" According principle, we should prepare and know a description of our works from the very beginning. It is not a coincidence that the famous British painter David Hockney wrote that people have a primal desire to transform the surrounding reality into works of art (such as paintings or photos). One of the exemplary painters who did not add a description to their works was the Polish painter Zdzislaw Beksinski. The famous artist repeatedly refused to comment on his paintings.

#### ARTWORK DESCRIPTION


Beksinski said that his works visualize his thoughts. He transformed his mystical and terrifying visions into images. However, the Polish painter avoided adding a description to his works. He did not want to accept or reject any comments and explanations that critics tried to give to his paintings. Also, Salvador Dali was unable to describe his works at times. One example is the painting "The Enigma of Hitler." He admitted that he did not know what the graphic meant. He only added that it was probably an unconscious transcription of his dreams, which he had after the Munich Agreement in 1938. Another example of the constant search for picture description was Vassily Kandinsky. It took him years to prepare the final story for his often abstract works.

As you can see, the creative process is not unequivocal. Artists often create first and then add a description to their work. If you are also taking photos, but you don't know why you are doing it, don't blame yourself, my Dear Friend. Give yourself time. Create, play, relax, ask questions and let your creativity flow in your blood for as long as possible.



#### THROUGH THE NEVER

The next post was called "Through the Never." The lyrics referred to the song of the same name performed by Metallica. It is an incredibly energetic and philosophical song. I have already mentioned in previous "Diaries" (08.2018 p. I) that "Black Album" is one of the best albums that have ever been made. The album of the group "Metallica" gives incredible power to be artistically active. The song "Through the Never" often brings me fresh new thoughts on many topics. The message of the song is, in my opinion, similar to one of my posts, titled "Ostensible Chaos." ("Diaries" 03.2018 p. II). The title track gives much nourishment for thought. Humanity is continuously eager to solve new puzzles, accumulates more and more information about the universe around us. Nevertheless, we have had and will have significant limitations in understanding the many processes that govern the universe until the end of our days.
